The following report was presented at the Friends of East Lake Community Library Annual Meeting. It looks at how well the Friends fulfilled its purpose throughout fiscal year 2024. This year I believe the Friends were able to make a real difference.

# **Enhancing Library Services and Facilities**

In 2024, the Friends budget earmarked \$25,000 for the library's operating budget. These funds were allocated by the

library director to pay for programs, books and other materials and services. Although the funds are only a small portion of the overall library operating budget, thanks to the director and staff, those funds were stretched far and had a real impact.

Friends' funds allocated for the operating budget were used for:

- Read Box books and DVDs—Popular, best-selling materials are available on a first come, first served basis only to people visiting the library. This collection allows library users to find and read a best seller without waiting on a long reserve list.
- Cloud library e-books, which make a wide range of popular titles available to library users.
- Other library online databases, plus library automation (catalog and check out systems).
- Computer hardware, including laptops for use by the public.
- Sunshine State Readers for children and teens.
- The Summer Reading Club online platform.
- Building repairs and facility improvements including, among other things, teen room bookcases and a portable air conditioning unit.
- Library programs for the public, including yoga and tai chi programs, a Women's History Month concert, a Murder Mystery Troupe and others.

Nothing enhances library services more than the effective, knowledgeable and friendly staff we have at the library. As part of the \$25,000 allocated to the library, the Friends have been funding tuition costs for two staff members. In June, the Friends celebrated the accomplishments of Nicole Farrell and

The new library will be a gathering place for the community and provide resources

such as materials, computers, study spaces, rentable facilities, unique services, and much more.

A picture with the jolly old elf captures the fun of the season and makes a great season's greeting in cards or on a Facebook page. For a donation to





# Did you know?....

- THE LARGEST ONE-STORY LIBRARY in the country just might be The McAllen Public Library in McAllen Texas which is housed in a converted Walmart location. The 123,000-square foot space has a computer lab, a café and a 180seat auditorium.
- ◆ THE SMALLEST LIBRARY in the world is located in a phone booth in Westbury, New York. It holds just a few dozen books and operates on the honor system.
- ◆ FINGERPRINTING SERVICES for state, federal, employment or volunteer requirements are now offered at East Lake Community Library, Mondays and Tuesdays, 2 pm—7 pm, and Wednesdays, 10 am—3 pm. The cost is \$35 plus government fees which vary. Appointments are required.
