Beyond the Book Stacks!

As we "March" into spring, there

is certainly rebirth and renewal at East Lake Community Library after several years of "semihibernation." We are looking forward to new projects and services as we plan and implement our Technology Plan and a new Long-Range Strategic Plan. But, before I get ahead of myself, I would like YOUR input for the upcoming budget year (October 2022 - September 2023). As you may know, we have been very successful in bringing innovative services to our community the 24/7 Locker System, the Collection Connections Service for our homebound patrons, our Passport Acceptance Facility, and the everpopular Gizmos and Gadgets Collection. But we must be missing something! Please e-mail me or fill out the survey forms at the front desk when you are in the library.

Although we have tried to keep Sunday hours for the past few months, it has become increasingly apparent that our small staff is stretched to the limit and unable to maintain the level of service necessary for our patrons. There are only four libraries in Pinellas County that are open on Sundays, all with much larger staffs. I feel it is more important to give our patrons the same level of service they should expect and deserve from Monday – Saturday and forego the Sunday hours for now. We will certainly re-examine our situation in the fall. The good news is we now have our 24/7 Locker System; and, the Countryside Branch of the Clearwater Library does have Sunday hours available, if the need arises.

Beginning in April, our hours will be as follows:

As we open up the library to more programs and outside groups, we have been examining the possibility of making better use of our outdoor spaces. This is especially important in light of how small our library is and the limited public space we have. This past year saw the creation of the outdoor pavilion known as the Tech Deck on the side of the Community Room. In 2022, with the help of Pinellas County funding, we are replacing the old wooden sheds across the driveway with one large aluminum shed that will be climate-controlled to protect our equipment, donations, and other items that we have no room to store in the library. Once that is complete, the Friends of the Library are raising funds to add on a permanent shade structure or canopy on the cement slab for special events, outdoor programming, or for use by community groups and organizations. We are hoping to have all of this in place by early 2023. Unfortunately, materials are backordered for months but we are starting the ordering process as soon as we receive approval from the Board of County Commissioners.

Enjoy our beautiful Florida weather before the heat and humidity return – or you can always cool off at the library!

2022 Annual Fund Don't Hesitate – Donate!

The East Like Community Library's 2022 Annual Fund has a goal of raising **\$10,000** by April 15th. The funds raised will combine with Friends existing funds and monies from county funding to create a year-round covered outdoor special events venue.

Our deteriorating wooden sheds will be replaced with one larger, durable shed with electric. Annual Fund money will be used to provide for a durable permanent canopy to compliment the shed. This will provide an outdoor covered venue where we can hold a wide variety of large and small group programs for every age level, concerts, meetings, and special events throughout the year. **BUT WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT!**

You are among the over 5,000 patrons who frequent our library each month – checking out materials around the clock with our Outdoor Locker System, attending free library programs for adults and children, using the computers and printers, and connecting to WiFi at our Tech Deck or inside the library. Now you can get passport photos and we can process new passports at ELCL. We continue strive to expand opportunities that best serve our community of patrons.

Library Concert Series

Let there be music! The popular East Lake Library Community Concert Series has two remaining concerts planned for 2022. Each concert will take place the last Sunday of the month, beginning at 2 pm, in the East Lake Library Community Room. A complimentary wine and cheese reception will follow each performance, allowing those attending to mingle with the musicians and fellow community members.

The 2022 Concert Series schedule is as follows:

- Sunday, March 27 Carlo Lovasco will sing country; saddle up for an enjoyable musical ride.
- Sunday, April 24 *Meriggaire String Quartet* will collaborate on timeless classical favorites.

Sponsored by the Friends of Eastlake Community Library, the Community Concert Series is designed to provide quality musical performances close to home at a very affordable cost. Priced at just *\$10 per event*, tickets are sure to sell quickly, so those with an interest in attending are advised to buy their seats as soon as possible. Tickets for all concerts are available at the library and at the door of each concert if space is available. Proceeds will benefit the library. The concerts will take place even though the library may be closed.

What's a Gizmo or a Gadget?

Though the 2020 Annual Fund drive was cut short by the pandemic, we raised \$8,875. We discussed ideas which would support our library's strategic plan "to enrich and inspire our community through new and expanded programs, technology, and services." With those funds, the **Gizmos and Gadgets** collection was created. The collection consists of 37 different items which patrons and staff expressed an interest in using or learning more about but did not necessarily want or need to own. Each comes in a case with directions and staff is available to answer any questions, too. We have a



portable air compressor, a standing mixer, a portable scanner, PlayStation 5, Nintendo Switch and Xbox controllers, a VHS-To-Digital converter, GoPro, folding wagon with big

wheels, a beach tent, CD player and outdoor games – cornhole, croquet, bocce ball, just to available.

As the ELCL's Strategic Plan 2019-2022 enters its final year, we look back on the efforts done in the current period and what is left to accomplish. Certainly, the opening of the Library's Community Room expansion in early 2019 was a great start! Further work to add more parking, provide cultural and social opportunities, strengthen community programs, and develop new relationships are being achieved. Even the turbulence created by things we couldn't have planned for (like Covid) gave us opportunities to think creatively, partner together, and provide more: 24/7 lockers to pick-up materials, a regularly stocked community food pantry, home delivery services for patrons with mobility restrictions, and passport services—just to name a few.

Looking ahead to development of the next multi-year ELCL Strategic Plan, the Library, Friends, and Foundation all look towards what we can continue to achieve together. Many times we are constrained not by the library staff's ability to host events and develop new programs, but by the space available in our facility.
